



lectio Divina

Lectio Divina is a tool that allows us to take steps, surrendering our own voice and listening instead to God through His Word. We're here to seek God's face, just as He tells us to.

In this practice, we are not adding to God's Word or expecting Him to say something He's not already said in His Word, but instead giving God our full attention (as much as we are able to do that) and setting aside the distractions that badger us all day long. Lectio Divina is an exercise in listening, with our mouths closed and our hearts open.





# Resources



What you need for the experience:

- \* your favorite version of the Bible
- \* printed copy of one of the worksheets provided OR your Bible journaling notebook
- \* a copy of the graphic provided for each reading throughout the week
- \* something to write with try to keep it simple
- \* a quiet space where you will not be disturbed or distracted (do your best)





Instructions for doing Lectio Divina in a small group

#### Listening to the Living Word of God - Christ Jesus in the Scriptures:

- 1. Listen as the passage is read twice. Listen for some segment that is especially meaningful to you.
- 2. SILENCE: 3-5 minutes. Silently meditate on a word or phrase that stands out.
- 3. Small Group: Briefly share (a word or phrase that has attracted you). A simple statement sharing with yourself (or others if in a group) a few words, or a theme, that stands out **No elaboration.**

#### How Christ the Word speaks to me:

- 1. Listen as the passage is read again (in a different version).
- 2. **SILENCE**: 5-7 minutes. Reflect on: Where does the content of this reading touch my life today?
- 3. Small Group: Share briefly: "I hear, I see..."

#### What Christ the Word invites me to DO:

- 1. Listen as the passage is read one more time.
- 2. **SILENCE**: 9-11 minutes. Reflect on: I believe that God wants me to ... today/this week/this year.
- 3. Small Group: Share aloud what you have learned and your responses.

Close with Prayer.





#### Instructions for doing Lectio Divina alone

#### Listening to the Living Word of God - Christ Jesus in the Scriptures:

- 1. Read the passage aloud twice. Listen for some segment that is especially meaningful to you.
- 2. SILENCE: 3-5 minutes. Silently meditate on a word or phrase that stands out.
- 3. Notice a word or phrase that has attracted you. A simple statement sharing with yourself, a few words, or a theme, that stands out. **No elaboration.**

#### How Christ the Word speaks to me:

- 1. Read the passage again (in a different version).
- 2. **SILENCE**: 5-7 minutes. Reflect on: Where does the content of this reading touch my life today?
- 3. Write down: "I hear, I see..."

#### What Christ the Word invites me to DO:

- 1. Read the passage (another version) one more time.
- 2. **SILENCE**: 9-11 minutes. Reflect on: I believe that God wants me to ... today/this week/this year.
- 3. Write down what you have learned and your responses.

Close with Prayer.

You will say in that day:
"I will give thanks to you, O Lord,
for though you were angry with me,
your anger turned away,
that you might comfort me.

and he has become my salvation."

With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation And you will say in that day:

"Give thanks to the Lord,
call upon his name,
make known his deeds among the peoples,
proclaim that his name is exalted.

"Sing praises to the Lord, for he has done gloriously; let this be made known in all the earth. Shout, and sing for joy, O inhabitant of Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel." Lectio Divina

for great is the Holy One of Israel among you."




# **NASB Third Reading Isaiah 12**


### **Thanksgiving Expressed**





